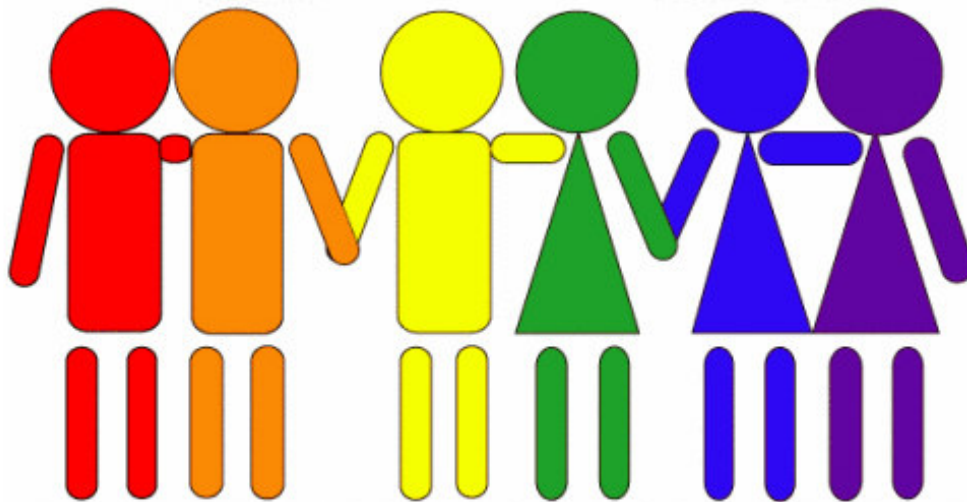


Homosexuality

All that I have been subjected to so far by these people has been emotionally-charged arguments which often degenerate into personal vilification and insults, but with nothing worthwhile to argue.

My starting point on this matter is that everyone, including gays and lesbians, is a biological consequence of male and female intercourse. And such intercourse is itself therefore the logical consequence of how nature behaves. In other words, male is meant to mate with female for the procreation of the species.

From this simple point and observation, it is rather illogical for same-sex unions to exist, as such arrangements fly in the face of nature.

Even die-hard lesbians and homosexuals will be hard-pressed to contradict that statement. I have often heard attempts by gays to justify their homosexuality as being repeated elsewhere in the animal kingdom, to "prove" that nature tolerates homosexuality."

To my way of thinking, this is as close to the bone as one can cut. And the core argument. Is that this clearly flies 'in the face of nature' and whether one argues from a natural or religious point of view is contrary to all norms. Unnatural and wrong will always remain unnatural and wrong, no matter how many laws and protests and sit-ins and objections one raises.

I do not accept that this can ever be a normal, logical practice. And whilst I am not going to go religious on the subject and start quoting biblical scripture after scripture, I will quote Qwelane once more (whilst conceding that he is not an authority)

"The second argument against this type of thing is scriptural: not a single religion anywhere condones and accepts homosexuality."

Now, it is certainly a fact that historically there have been certain individuals that have practiced and were openly homosexual, Cecil John Rhodes being one, and only recently have we had the explosion and proliferation of cries about their "human rights" and mostly from the hugely infiltrated Psychological fraternity. Not that all psychologists are homosexual, just that they have found a haven and a home amongst the fraternity, there are many in all other professions as well, and just that this profession has chosen to advocate and stand up for their interests above all others.

And having said all of that, I must say as with a pendulum, issues of this nature have extremes to which they will naturally swing, and one finds that such extremes maintain such things as any normal person would rather shy away from. If left to its own devices, the pendulum will naturally return to a centered, balanced and "normal" position, IF left to do so.

Personally I hold a live and let live attitude, until I am confronted and affronted by this. And as such I chose not to support anyone openly practicing such a lifestyle and I will take my business elsewhere. As people I cannot find fault but I will not and cannot support their views.

COLUMN EQUATES HOMOSEXUALITY WITH BESTIALITY

The board of Joburg Gay Pride Festival today lodged an objection with the Press Ombudsman against the column titled "Call me names, but gay is NOT okay..." by Jon Qwelane published in the Sunday Sun of 20 July 2008.

The column depicts a man and goat kneeling before a church official as they are pronounced 'man and goat.' This equates the practise of homosexuality to bestiality - a gross inaccuracy that helps fuel misunderstandings of homosexuality by the public.

In addition to linking bestiality with homosexuality in the piece, Qwelane also urges politicians to remove the sexual orientation equality clause in the constitution and praises Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe's oppression of gays and lesbians in that country.

Joburg Pride calls for the Sunday Sun to publish a withdrawal of the column and to make a public apology to the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) community of South Africa.

"While we accept that Mr Qwelane is entitled to his personal opinion, we feel that the publication of the column amounts to hate speech and can only serve to incite further violence against the LGBT community," says joint chairperson Zak Mbhele. "LGBT South Africans experience regular discrimination on the grounds of their sexual orientation, and this can take the form of violence."

South Africa still has a high incidence of hate crimes perpetrated against members of the gay community, says Mbhele, and when a public figure such as Jon Qwelane is permitted to share his rantings this can incite further violence.

"The publication of this piece by the Sunday Sun is irresponsible and inflammatory," says Mbhele, "and the newspaper needs to take a long hard look at its editorial policy if it currently views such comment as acceptable."

*What is a Hate Crime?

A hate crime is an extreme expression of prejudice, expressed through violent criminal acts, committed against people because of the group to which they belong or identify with. Perpetrators of hate crimes seek to demean and dehumanise their victims whom they consider different from them because of their actual or perceived race, gender, sexual orientation, health status, social origin or other characteristics. The prejudice of the perpetrator is what makes a hate crime distinct from other acts of violence.
